Free treatments for Headlice and Scabies

Woolworths Pharmacy Rotorua (Formerly Countdown Pharmacy Rotorua) would like to inform that our pharmacy is now able to provide free treatments for Headlice and Scabies for anyone over the age of 2 via a short pharmacist consultation (usually 5-10 minutes).

This service is funded and will enable the public to more easily access Head lice and Scabies treatments without prescription and also remove cost-related barriers. No appointments are needed. The person needing the treatment or their parent/s can just come into our pharmacy and ask for the consultation and the pharmacist will provide a private room for the short consult, where the pharmacist will check the symptoms, ask a few relevant questions, determine if the product is suitable and provide the relevant product with advice, or refer to doctor if needed.

For the Headlice service, we are able to provide 1 bottle of Headlice treatment lotion and a lice comb for each person in the household needing treatment.

For the Scabies service, we are able to provide 2 bottles of Anti-scabies lotion for each person in the household, plus a tube of anti-itch cream if needed.

The service is completely free of charge and in addition to the products, relevant information leaflets will be provided.
