MAHURI

Fitness is happening each day and we are nearing the end of our circuit training. We will be using these results to help us with our statistical unit in maths starting next week.



The children have started their speech introductions and will be finishing their speeches at home for homework over the next 5 weeks.

Please assist them with their speeches, but don't do it for them :)



Currently in maths we are looking at fractions and this week we have been playing games to help us recognise which is the larger or smaller fraction. $\frac{3}{5}$ or $\frac{2}{3}$ etc.



Fact of the week: "Sweating like a pig" is a UPU misleading phrase since pigs can't sweat! Pigs don't have many sweat glands, so they roll around and sleep in mud and swim in water to keep cool.

As part of our structured literacy programme we focus on two letter sounds each week. This week it was /p/ and /o/ (the short vowel sound for /o/). We practice saying the sound, noticing how our mouth moves/feels, identifying the letter name, identifying objects and words that we know use the sound, writing the letter correctly (handwriting), and using the sound to make and break words; p - o - p, pop.



As part of /p/ work this week we made some animals in the shape of a 'p' that start with the letter 'p'. The class really enjoyed all the cutting and glueing and have already asked to make more animals.

Highlights this week have been playing in the sandpit, music & movement, snakes & ladders and new library books.
