All the children enjoyed their day. Mums, Dads, grandparents, and families were very proud of all our kids' confidence on the day. Thanks, Sam Allen.










Fact of the week: A crocodile can not stick its tongue out.





Our writing focus this term is 'Narrative Writing'. Narrative writing is a style that allows the writer to tell a story (fiction or nonfiction) and sustain the reader's attention. We have been using pictures to prompt our story-telling and writing; looking beyond what we

first see (a boat) and noticing the smaller details and asking questions about what might be happening or happening next. We have been discussing different ways we can describe objects; 'what word could we use instead of big?' We have been getting great descriptive language in our story-telling and we are now working on including it in our writing too.
