

In Mahuri we have been practising for our Kapa Haka Festival next Friday 30th August.
We will be performing lots of waiata. We have been making a few mistakes along the way as

we learn but we know that "It's okay to make mistakes". We need to recognise our mistakes and learn from them. Things are often hard until they are easy and they become easy by practising, making mistakes, problem solving and practising some more. We learned that not just girls and women use poi, we learned that Maori warriors use poi to make their wrists stronger. We learned four new Te Reo words relating to poi. Runga - up, raro - down, roto - close, waho - out.



Te Ngahere Boys don't wear t-shirts but we

wear shorts at Kapa Haka. The songs that we sing at Kapa Haka are Toia Mai, Te Hei Mauri Ora, Ko Tarawera, Tane Mahuta and the Haka.



Kapa Haka is in one week. The whole school is going to Reporoa school in cars and the bus and we are going in black t-shirts with wobbly blue lines and a skirt with blue maori designs and the boys are going to kapa haka with a headband around their head and shorts but a skirt is covering their shorts, kind of.



In Kapa Haka we wear no t-shirts but we wear shorts. We go down to the Reporoa hall and we use pois. One of the songs is Toia Mai. Other schools come to the hall. My favourite song we do is the Haka. There are other songs we do. The Maori warriors use pois to strengthen their wrists.
