Dear Rerewhakaaitu Community.

I know I have spoken to many of you about this face to face but wanted to explain a bit further and

Our Playcentre has been in the community for over 50 years now and provided many of us happy memories. Sadly, it closed its doors back in 2021 due to low numbers and increasing compliance requirements from Ministry of Education

It was decided between Playcentre Aotearoa and locals that it would remain a community building and so it stayed, looking exactly as it did when we walked out and shut the doors.

Playcentre Aotearoa was working through the lease process with key stakeholders and the Council and was nearing completion to hand it over to the guardianship of the community through the Hall

Unfortunately, as it was falling back into the hands of the Council, it became clear that they were not keen on keeping the building.

Playcentre Aotearoa has been told by the Council that the building needs to be removed and returned to original state. This isn't something that can be argued further or changed, as I am sure you agree, it's vital that we keep the Hall open and in use for everyone. This would be under threat if we were to argue the demolition further.

We are all really disappointed.

I have been working through distributing equipment to other local Playcentres and Lake Rerewhakaaitu School so that it's back in use for kids again. It's very strange to see the place

The building will be demolished in time and the land reinstated to the condition the Council require us to do so.

Given the importance of some of the items, I have been kindly donated a large dresser which can be in the hall supper room to contain the plaques, korowai and memories that have been stored for so long, for the community to see. The playhouse and fort will hopefully move across to the school to keep providing joy for the children.

I know this will be hard on many of us. There are so many in this community who fought to keep it going and are passionate about the place and all it meant to many. The memories will go on in our hearts




